### THE HOLY APOSTLE JAMES, BROTHER OF THE LORD

COMMEMORATED THIS DAY

James is called the Lord's brother because he was the son of the righteous Joseph, the betrothed of the Most-holy Theotokos. From the beginning, James was devoted to the Lord Jesus. According to tradition, he traveled to Egypt with the Most-holy Virgin and Joseph, when Herod sought to slay the newborn King. Later, as soon as he heard Christ's teaching, James lived by it. It is said of him that he never ate fat or oil, but lived on just bread and water, and was a virgin to the end of his life on earth. He often kept vigil at night and prayed to God. The Lord numbered him among His Seventy Apostles. Following His glorious Resurrection, the Lord appeared to him especially, as the Apostle Paul testifies (1 Corinthians 15:7). He was Bishop of Jerusalem for thirty years and zealously governed the Church of God.

### ∞ ANNOUNCEMENTS ∞

**IT HAS BEEN AROUND 10 YEARS SINCE WE'VE HAD AN OFFICIAL ARCHPASTORAL VISIT TO OUR PARISH.** We are all filled with joy and excitement about Bishop Alexander being in our midst on the last weekend of this month. Please allow me to share with you some points of Orthodox etiquette pertinent to His Grace being with us. When the Bishop is present please do not ask the priest for a blessing, but make a small reverence before His Grace (without crossing yourself), and then place your right hand over your left (palms up) and say "Master

Bless", then kiss his right hand. Please do your best to arrive at Church and finish with venerating icons and lighting candles before the Bishop's arrival at 9:00 a.m. If you arrive late, it is best that you simply go to your place and venerate icons and light candles after the conclusion of the service. During the Archpastoral Liturgy there are times when the Bishop blesses with special long candles called "Dikiri & Trikiri". Please bow towards His Grace as he makes this blessing in your direction. After the small entrance there are several times when only the clergy are supposed to sing. Your cue for those hymns would be that the choir will not be singing, only the clergy. Thank you for your help in giving our Bishop a proper welcome to our wonderful Parish!

**THE MEAL ON THE SUNDAY OF THE BISHOP'S VISIT** on 11/30 is different than usual: LAST NAMES beginning N-Z are asked to bring Salads or other Sides for the meal. There is a sign up sheet on the Literature Table to indicate what salad or side you will bring so we don't end up with just tossed salad. LAST NAMES beginning A-M are asked to bring Desserts and Fruit (no sign up sheet for you). Especially with desserts, feel free to bring them on Saturday (cut up and portioned, on trays if necessary) if you are attending the Bishop's lecture but please mark them for Sunday and place in the refrigerator. FYI, we all plan to be in the church at 9:00am for the arrival of the Bishop and after Liturgy the kitchen crew will be busy getting things ready to serve the head table so please help us by bringing your items ready to serve (i.e. pies and cakes sliced, salads in the bowls they will be served in, cookies on platters, etc). We appreciate the help. If you have any questions, please see Monica.

**ACQUIRING THE MIND OF CHRIST:** *Embracing the Vision of the Orthodox Church:* On October 18<sup>th</sup> we began a new book study on this work of Archimandrite Sergius. "St Paul clearly states: 'Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus...' (Phil 2:5.) How do we acquire this Mind of Christ and where is it to be found? For the Orthodox Christian, salvation is the acquisition of this Mind of Christ which is to be found in the Church. This acquisition moves us from the image of God to the likeness of God; through our obedience to this call we begin to know God and this knowledge is eternal life (John 17:3). This small book hopes to begin to answer how acquiring the Mind of Christ is possible and why it is necessary in our lives today. Fr Archimandrite Sergius serves as the 16<sup>th</sup> Abbot of St Tikhon's Monastery. He teaches at St Tikhon's Seminary and has traveled extensively for the Monastery and Seminary giving talks and retreats."
