Our typical time for Confession is on Saturdays after Great Vespers. However, I'm available at other times if you would like to contact me and make an appointment. We are honored you are visiting today. * Liturgy **Books** may be found on the **Candle Table** at the back of the church. * We **invite you to fill out a Visitor's Card**, also on the Candle Table & place it in one of the Collection Baskets there. * We do not take up a **Collection** during our services but rather ask you to place donations in one of the baskets on the Candle Table or next to the **Book Store Table**. * While only Orthodox Christians who have prepared themselves may receive **Holy Communion**, everyone is welcome to come forward at the end of Liturgy to receive a blessing from our priest and to take the blessed bread. * It is the **Orthodox practice** to stand during services as a sign of reverence for the Lord but if you need to sit, please do so. Use of chairs is shared. If you are able, we particularly try to stand during the processions with the Gospel and the Gifts, during the Readings, the Creed, during the preparation of the Holy Eucharist, the Lord's Prayer and reception of Communion. * We **invite you** to stay after the Thanksgiving Prayers **for fellowship** and coffee, so that we may greet you personally, and to answer any questions you may have about our faith, our parish or today's service. * Please help yourself to the brochures and information on the east side counter. * All children **ages three through twelve** are encouraged to attend our Sunday School after Holy Communion. * **We hope you will visit us again very soon.** *

- **CLEANING FOR PASCHA:** Thank you to all who worked on both the inside and outside of the church to prepare for Pascha to the Glory of God. Thank you! and again, Thank you!
- **PALMS & PUSSY WILLOWS:** We will tie the palms and pussy willows this Friday, April 11th, at 4:30pm. All are welcome & encouraged to take part.
- **FUNDRAISER DINNER:** Next Sunday, April 13th, is Palm Sunday and the sisterhood will host a Dinner Fundraiser. Baked tilapia will be served with rice, green beans, salad, roll and a dessert. We will have a suggested donation for adults of \$7.⁰⁰ and for the children of \$3.⁰⁰. Mark your calendars and plan to stay for this joyous annual event. Proceeds go to the work of the Sisterhood.
- **AGAPE MEAL HOLY SATURDAY VESPERAL DIVINE LITURGY APRIL 19th.** After Vespereal Divine Liturgy we traditionally break our fast with bread, wine, grapes, dates & figs. There is a sign up sheet on the Literature Table. Please bring bread to church sliced and grapes washed and cut into portions or come early enough to complete these tasks BEFORE the Vespereal Divine Liturgy.
- **RED EGGS FOR PASCHA.** We need 100+ hardboiled eggs dyed scarlet red for distribution at the end of the Paschal Liturgy. There is a sign up sheet on the Literature Table. Greek red dye is sold in the bookstore or use onion skins. Please bring eggs to church on Holy Friday, Holy Saturday morning or by 11:00pm on Holy Saturday night thoroughly refrigerator cool and dry.
- **FLOWER BASKET:** A donation basket is out next to the Tithes Collection Box for donations to purchase Palm Sunday palms and pussy willows, Holy Friday tomb flowers and Pascha flowers. Write "Flowers" on your check's memo line.

This prayer is incorporated in every weekday service during the Great Fast, but we should also include it in our own prayer rule as well. PRAYER OF ST. EPHRAIM

O Lord and Master of my life! Take from me the spirit of sloth, despair, lust of power, and idle talk (full prostration). But give rather the spirit of chastity, humility, patience, and love to Thy servant (full prostration). Yea, O Lord and King! Grant me to see my own transgressions and not to judge my brother; for blessed art Thou unto ages of ages. Amen (full prostration).

O God, cleanse me a sinner and have mercy on me (12 times, bowing each time).
(Then repeat the entire prayer as a whole with one full prostration at the end.)
