

In 1994, five families of Orthodox faithful met with the ever-memorable Archpriest George Sondergaard to plan the founding of an English-language OCA mission here in Albuquerque. God blessed our efforts and, through the years, our community has grown and prospered. Father George led the Church family from their humble beginnings to today's location on two acres in the North Rio Grande River Valley of Albuquerque. Father Nikolay Miletkov took over the daily administration of the Church in 2010, and continues to minister to our ever-growing community.

Our parish has various ministries geared toward serving both the members of the Church and the community at large; such as the OCF, both men's and women's groups, a youth group, Sunday school, etc.



About this Campaign

As Orthodox Christians, we confess all that we have in this world comes from God's bounty. As a parish, we have received many blessings, both from God and His people. We are now called upon, each and every one of us, to raise up a new temple to the worship of the Holy Trinity. Our new temple will draw many to us: those seeking the truth of Orthodoxy and those re-discovering their ancestral faith. This is in line with the mission of our Church and is focused on enriching and building the lives of our parishioners and visitors.

The objective of this Church Building Campaign is to build our permanent Church temple, moving out of our Parish Hall in order to use the hall as it was intended, giving the community and God a place to meet together.

God now calls us to be bold and to do His will in faith, hope, and love. We stand on the threshold of the future of our parish. We need your help to make our dreams a reality. Let us step forth in faith!



The New Church

The 4,700 sq. ft. new Church building is designed by Architect Michael Bertin of Architectural Harmonics. It will provide a significantly larger space for worship, accommodating at least 230 people, while also freeing up the existing Church building to fulfill its original function as parish hall. The design blends traditional byzantine architecture with local southwestern motifs. The interior will feature an entry area (exonarthex), vestibule (narthex), main worship area (Nave) with plenty of room for the choir, and adequate space for the Altar with

adjacent prothesis and sacristy area. Additionally this new building will also have a Church office, nursing room, choir office, storage area, and restrooms.


The repurposed parish hall will continue to provide space for our Church fellowship, library, bookstore, Church school, kitchen and additional storage space.

Our Capital Campaign

The Capital Campaign has set two goals to reach before we move onto the next phase of securing financing and building the new temple.

1. Pay off the remaining balance of the existing loan (roughly \$19,563).
2. Reach \$600,000 in our building fund. The Church has already raised approximately \$335,000, which means raising the additional \$265,000 before securing financing for the remaining amount.

The total cost of the Church is estimated at approximately \$1 million, not including landscaping and parking lot updates.



Where we are

The balance of the existing loan was \$45,401.93 at the beginning of 2016 and the Church has paid it down to \$19,563.48 as of December 31, 2016. At our current and historical rate of payment, this should be paid off by the end of 2017, at which point we will begin saving these payments in our building fund.

By the end of 2016 the building fund has reached \$335,605.96.

What can you do?

There are many ways in which you can participate in this capital campaign. Foremost, pray, for without God's blessing we can never succeed.

As you pray, we ask you to recall the blessings God has given to you, remembering that everything we have belongs to God. All Saints needs each of us to discern, with God's help, what we can do, what we can give to the Capital Campaign to build a fitting temple to His glory that will be here for future Orthodox generations. **Regardless of size**, each gift is an important contribution to our campaign.

You can make an outright gift which may be paid immediately or pledged over the next two years. You may also choose to make a separate monthly contribution to the building fund. A pledge form is at the end of this brochure. You may make a gift of securities such as bonds, stocks or mutual funds to the parish




which can be held in our name and redeemed as needed. Please also consider remembering us in your will in order to help with our future mortgage.

Other ways you can help: We are looking for your ideas and feedback on ways to raise money, while staying true and focused on our Orthodox faith. Do you have experience in capital campaigns? Have a good idea? Either way, your help is welcome!

Don't forget that contributions to the building fund are tax-deductible, and feel free to pass on this report to those who may be interested. Also, while we are thinking and praying about the financial support of our parish, we encourage you to consider remembering All Saints in your will and estate planning.

Special Gifts

There will be a time when there will be a need for particular items to furnish our new Church that are integral parts of the fabric of the building; such as the Iconostasis and Holy Table. If you are interested in donating towards these items, please contact Fr. Nikolay.



Acknowledging the Gifts

As is the custom in many of our parishes now, all the gifts we receive in response to our capital campaign will be permanently recorded. These will be kept in the Church as a memorial for future generations. *Any gift to the capital campaign may be made in loving memory of departed members of families or friends or for the health and welfare of families and friends.* Their names will be written in our memorial book. The living and departed Orthodox will be commemorated at every Divine Liturgy at All Saints. We intend for this

memorial book to be displayed in the narthex of the Church, available to all, a permanent testimony of our gratitude for the love and support of our members, friends, and families.
