## Sunday of the Prodigal Son

COMMEMORATED THIS DAY

The Sunday after the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee is the Sunday of the Prodigal Son. This parable of God's forgiveness calls us to come to ourselves as did the prodigal son, to see ourselves as being in a far country, far from the Father's house, and to make the journey of return to God. We are given every assurance by the Master that our heavenly Father will receive us with joy and gladness. We must only arise and go, confessing our self-inflicted and sinful separation from that home where we truly belong (Luke 15:11-24). After the Polyeleion at Matins, we first hear the Lenten hymn By the Waters of Babylon. It will be sung for the next two Sundays before Lent begins, and it serves to reinforce the theme of exile in today's Gospel.

If you are able, we particularly try to stand during the processions with the Gospel and the Gifts, during the Readings, the Creed, during the preparation of the Holy Eucharist, the Lord's Prayer and reception of Communion. \* We **invite you** to stay after the Thanksgiving Prayers **for fellowship** and coffee, so that we may greet you personally, and to answer any questions you may have about our faith, our parish or today's service. \* Please help yourself to the brochures and information on the east side counter. \* All children **ages three through twelve** are encouraged to attend our Sunday School after Holy Communion.

## Venerable Eugene and his daughter Mary at Alexandria

ALSO COMMEMORATED THIS DAY

Saint Eugene and his daughter Maria lived at the beginning of the sixth century in Bithynia (northwestern Asia Minor). After the death of his wife, Eugene decided to withdraw to a monastery, but his daughter did not want to be separated from him, and so she accompanied him, dressed as a man. Together they entered a monastery not far from Alexandria, and the daughter received the name Marinus. An inn-keeper's daughter, having sinned with one of the lodgers, denounced this Marinus and named "him" as the father of her child. When the hapless girl gave birth to a boy, the inn-keeper brought it to Marinus. The saint took the infant and began to raise him. Three years later the saint peacefully reposed in her cell. The brethren began to dress the saint for burial & her secret was revealed. The body of St Maria was reverently buried in the monastery. The inn-keeper's daughter came to the grave of the saint and openly confessed her sin. Immediately, she was freed from the evil spirit which had been tormenting her. The boy whom the saint was raising later became a monk.
